2003 - 2004 Myofascial Release

- I, II, Cervico-thoracic, Fascial Pelvis, Unwinding, Skill enhancement Seminar
- A basic introduction to myofascial release and its application to the body.

Visceral Manipulation – Barral Institute

2003 Visceral Manipulation Abdomen 1

- An introduction to the basic theories, principles and techniques of visceral manipulation.
- The anatomy, functional mechanics and techniques for identifying the abdominal organs and their respective interconnecting tissue: liver, stomach, gall bladder, biliary ducts, duodenum, pancreatic ducts, major sphincter-like zones, small intestine, and colon.
- An introduction to evaluation tools for general and local listening, motility listening, mobility testing and inhibition techniques.

2004 Visceral Manipulation Abdomen 2

- An expansion of the concepts and techniques of abdomen 1. Each abdominal organ, its related ligament systems and their functional / structural mechanics.
- An understanding of the effects of trauma on proper physiological functioning.

2005 Visceral Manipulation 3: Pelvis and Urogenital System

- The structural and functional mechanics of the components of the pelvic cavity and the interconnection between lower limb and pelvic dysfunction.
- Highlights the pelvic cavity into:
 - the hard frame: pubic symphysis, obturator foramina, coccyx, sacrum and lumbar spine
 - the soft frame: muscles and fascia of the pelvic basin and floor.
- Discusses the effects of pelvic surgeries: hysterectomy, caesarian sections, abdominoplasty, appendectomy, etc., and the effects on the body.

2005 Visceral Manipulation 4: The Thorax

- Focused on biomechanics, anatomy, physiology and functions of the hard and soft frame of the thorax.
- An understanding of the mechanisms of breathing, the effects of trauma whether surgical, visceral, or obstetrical on the mechanisms of the thorax, vascular and digestive systems.

2005 Visceral Approach to Trauma and Whiplash – Neuromeningeal manipulation

- Focused on the effects of trauma on the human body.
- Addresses tissue and emotional reactivity to trauma and how therapists can assist release.

2005 / 2007 Listening Techniques – An Osteopathic Approach to Evaluation Procedures

- Listening is described as the “heart” of visceral manipulation.
- This course teaches evaluative techniques for listening to the body and allowing it to direct the therapist.

2006 Manual Thermal Evaluation and Visceremotional I

- Designed to feel tissue resistance and heat in the body.
- Holding the hands near but not touching the patient's skin to sense variations in thermal radiation and permitting the localization and interpretation of pathological zones.

2007 Peripheral Nerve Manipulation Upper Body

- Focused on the central and peripheral nervous system of the human body.
- Techniques to identify and release restrictions in both the central and peripheral nervous systems of the upper body as they relate to overall pathology.

2009 Introduction to the Nervous system - Christoph Sommer

- Focuses on the classic subdivisions of the central and peripheral nervous systems.
- The anatomy, physiology, and embryology of the brain and spinal cord.
- An introduction to neurology and pre-requisite for the peripheral nerve courses following.

2009 Peripheral Nerve Manipulation Lower Body

- Focused on the central and peripheral nervous systems primarily of the lower body.
- Techniques of identifying and releasing restrictions in the central nervous system as well as the lower peripheral nerves.

Fascial Membrane

2008 Fascial Membrane Technique (FMT) – Interacting cavities: Thorax, Abdomen and Pelvis (FMT1)

- Offered for the first time by the Barral Institute, Dr. Peter Schwind, a Certified Advanced Rolfer™ from Germany, conducted a four-day workshop in San Francisco (November, 2008).
- Practical theoretical course based on the observation that various types of connective tissue fulfill several functions within the body. The musculoskeletal system acts as a container for the body's inner cavities, organs and central nervous system. FMT techniques provide a bridge to access these various subsystems.
